Dear Parents/Guardians:

As our school year winds down, we are busy already making plans for next school year! As we previously reported, the elementary buildings will be reconfigured to a grade-centered model next school year. Starting in September 2019, students in grades PreK-2 will attend Dexter Elementary School, and students in grades 3-6 will attend Brownville-Glen Park Elementary School. We have spent most of the spring planning for the changes, so that the transition for the students and your families goes as smooth as possible. We know that transportation was a concern voiced by many families, so the District worked with an outside group, School Bus Consultants, to study our current bus runs and the proposed changes to the transportation plan to make sure that we were running as efficiently as possible with respect to ride times. While we are still fine-tuning those details, we found that even with the extra stop at the other elementary school and some adjustments to our current bus routes, student ride times could be reduced.

We have created a Reconfiguration Transportation Survey for each family to complete with specific details for pick-up and drop-off locations for all children. It's important that information be returned to either elementary school or District Office as soon as those details are worked out, so that we have ample time to plan for any changes in transportation for your children. These forms will be sent home with children on the last day of school. Additionally, we will be finalizing bus routes with approximate pick-up and drop-off time, and letters with this information will be mailed to families in August. Finally, we will be planning a meeting or event to talk with families later this summer; be on the lookout for information related to that via email and social media.
